The Galt Historic Railway Park

This Victorian Depot was built in 1890 by Sir Alexander Galt and his son Elliott Galt.

The grand old depot was a part of the facilities on the Great Falls and Canada Railway (stretching from Great Falls, Montana to Lethbridge, Alberta) and it was one of the only two "lunch stations".

Straddling the international border, its massive platform stretched from Sweetgrass, MT into Coutts, AB from 1890 to 1917. It was truly the international "port of entry" by rail.

The vision of the future of the Galt Historic Railway Park includes operable grain elevator, a historic round house and turntable, and railway dining cars, along with regular presentations of railway themed events.
